

Understanding the World (Science)

This term we will be teaching the vocabulary for materials – wood, fabric, plastic, glass, metal. We will explore which objects are around the classroom and outside, we will also explore magnetic and non-magnetic. We will also look closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change in materials > link to ice melting. In addition, we will develop the vocabulary – weak and strong (linking to our talk for witing - 3 little pigs house materials).

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Maths

We will continue to work on numbers looking at subitising and the composition of numbers.

We will revisit and continue developing our knowledge on shapes by looking at shapes with 4 sides. We will start by naming squares and rectangles and looking at the similarities and differences between them. We will explore how we can combine different 2D shapes to make new shapes. Children will also be encouraged to spot 2D shapes in the environment at school, home and when they are out and about!

We will also be exploring measures including capacity, mass, length and height. The children will have the opportunity to use a variety of equipment to measure in different ways.

Vocabulary sides, corners, straight, curved, heavier, lighter, balanced, mass, capacity, longest/longer, shortest/shorter, tallest/taller.

Understanding the World (History)
