- ◆ creation story: A story that explains how the Earth and humans came into existence.
- ◆ Darwin: a scientist who developed a scientific theory of evolution.
- ◆ evolution: the process by which living things gradually change over time.
- ◆ Genesis: first book of the Bible
- ◆ Humanism: a group of people that do not believe in a God
- ◆ Old Testament: the first part of the Bible
- ◆ reincarnation: rebirth of a soul.
- ◆ Waheguru: Sikh god

- ◆ Humanists and non-faith people believe in the Big Bang and has developed through the process of evolution.
