

# Year 2 return to school in September 2020

## ***Does my child have to attend school in September?***

Yes, from Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> September all children **must** return to school.

Your child will spend the first two days in their Year 1 class and move into their Year 2 class on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September

## **Which Year 2 class is my child in?**

A Dragonfly will become a Badger

A Firefly will become a Squirrel

A Bumblebee will become a Hedgehog

## ***How will you keep my child safe?***

Our risk assessments will be available on our website. We have put measures in place to keep our community as safe as possible. We cannot guarantee that your child could become unwell at any time.

## ***Can I call into the school office to drop something off or meet my child's teacher?***

No, the site is closed except for essential contractors and maintenance that are pre-arranged. Please call or email us.

### ***What will my child wear?***

Full school uniform must be worn each day, except on a day when your child has P.E details of P.E. days will be on the Year group notes on the website.

On days when your child has PE they should come to school in PE kit, this should include jogging bottoms, hoodies and trainers.

Children must bring a coat.

Book Bags, lunchboxes and water bottles are the only other items that can be brought into school.

No other items must be brought between school and home.

School lunches will be available to order from JJ catering. Contact Gail directly.

Start and end times will be staggered.  
My child will start school at 8:50 am and finish at 3:05 pm.

### **Drop off information**

Bring your child up the path opposite the Peace Park on to the Year 1/2 playground. Children collected by the teacher.  
Parent exit site down the main drive.

### **Pick up information**

Walk up the path opposite the Peace Park on to the Year 1/2 playground. Collect your child from the teacher.  
Exit site down the main drive.

**All children must arrive and be collected on time.**

# School response if a child displays symptoms during school time.

Concern raised by the child themselves or by an adult supervising.

Person is isolated immediately. Child's parents will be contacted.

Child **must** be collected **immediately** from school.

Test **MUST** be arranged and **must** take place.

All families must engage with the Test and Trace process.

Parents **MUST** inform school of test outcome **immediately**.

## **Negative Test Result:**

The child can return to school, if they are well enough to do so and no one in the household is displaying symptoms or awaiting test results.

## **Positive Test Result:**

NHS Advice is:

If the test is positive, you must self-isolate.

- If you had a test because you had symptoms, keep self-isolating for at least 7 days from when your symptoms started.
- If you had a test but have not had symptoms, self-isolate for 7 days from when you had the test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must self-isolate for 14 days from when you start self-isolating.

If a result is received on a weekend, families **must inform school by 9am on the Monday morning.**

# What if my child displays symptoms at home?

Isolate your child where possible.

Do not allow your child to attend school or other public places.

Mandatory 7 days of self-isolation.

Test **MUST** be arranged and **must** take place.

All families must engage with the Test and Trace process.

Parents **MUST** inform school of test outcome **immediately**.

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The child can return to school, if they are well enough to do so and no one in the household is displaying symptoms or awaiting test results.

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NHS Advice is:

If the test is positive, you must self-isolate.

- If you had a test because you had symptoms, keep self-isolating for at least 7 days from when your symptoms started.

- If you had a test but have not had symptoms, self-isolate for 7 days from when you had the test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must self-isolate for 14 days from when you start self-isolating.

If a result is received on a weekend, families **must inform school by 9am on the Monday morning.**

# Other FAQs

## ***If my child arrives late?***

*Please ring the bell. The child will then be escorted to their class. Parents cannot come into the school.*

## ***If my child has a medical appointment during the school day?***

*Please ensure you have informed the teacher and the office by email prior to the appointment. Ring door bell and your child will be brought out to you.*

## ***My child has medication. How do I arrange for this to be taken in school time?***

If medication is prescribed for 4 times a day and a lunchtime dose needs to be administered please email Mrs Peet who will arrange for a medical form to be made available to you. Please hand medication and completed form to your child's teacher.

## ***Will children social distance in school?***

Children within the same bubble will be in their year groups. Guidance states that children within the bubble may not be able to distance socially. Adults will distance from children as much as possible.
