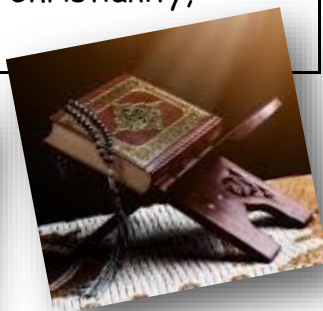
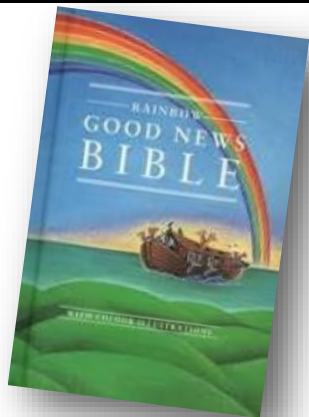


What I should already know

Patriarch: Founding fathers of Judaism

Scripture/sacred texts: Special books for different religions
