We have another busy term ahead of us.

Our science topic this half term will be 'Health and Movement'. We will consider how to have a balanced, healthy diet, as well as looking at what different animals eat. Then we will go on to look at animal and human skeletons, how they support and protect us and how our muscles work. We are looking forward to our 'skeletons experience day' on Wednesday 24th January.

In geography, we will be learning to use maps and atlases to locate continents, countries and capital cities, before focusing on some counties and cities of the U.K.
